

TOWNHALL DATA BY SUM AND AVERAGE

In our second town hall, we gave sixty-nine people small comment cards and asked them to rank the importance of eleven categories, 1 being of the highest importance, 11 being of the least importance.

Then, we calculated the data by adding all the rankings for each individual category, and divided that sum by the number of people who took the survey. For example, “Education” was ranked highest on the list, because it had the smallest sum (and therefore more 1s and 2s). “Less Traffic” was ranked the least important because it had the largest sum (and therefore more 10s and 11s).
